


PRAYER & PRAISE POINTS

I AM A FUNCTIONING CHURCH MEMBER

The three smallest bones in the human body are the middle ear ossicles - the malleus, incus, and stapes (more commonly known as the hammer, anvil, and stirrup). Although these three tiny bones work in obscurity, completely invisible to the outside world, they are absolutely essential to our ability to hear. Without them, only 0.1 percent of the sound we hear would be transferred to the inner ear. Putting it another way these three small, obscure bones are responsible for 99.9% of the sound we hear. God has arranged these tiny parts in such a way that maximizes their effect far beyond their diminutive size. Despite being the smallest in size they are far from being insignificant. Just as the human body has no insignificant parts, the body of Christ has no small or unimportant members. We all have a vital part to play (however large or small, however visible or invisible) in God's plan for redeeming and restoring the world. We may be as well-hidden as a bone in



the inner ear, an internal organ, or a foot inside a shoe, but every single believer is absolutely essential to the eternal purpose of God. **“All of you together are Christ’s body, and each of you is a part of it.” (1 Corinthians 12:27)**

I love how Paul describes the church as a body in 1 Corinthians 12:12-27. In using this analogy Paul not only highlights the importance of each part, he also reminds us of how much each part depends on the other parts of the body. We have all experienced how something as simple as a toothache, or a bruised little toe can affect other parts of the body and the way we function. While every part has an important role to play, no part is independent. All parts must work together so that the body can function well as a whole. **“But our bodies have many parts, and God has put each part just where he wants it. How strange a body would be if it had only one part! Yes, there are many parts, but only one body. The eye can never say to the hand, “I don’t need you.” The head can’t say to the feet, “I don’t need you.” (1 Corinthians 12:18-21)** As followers of Christ we too are interrelated with every other person in the body of Christ – the Church. Though each believer may be unique, each believer is also dependent on the rest. Like interrelated body parts, church members must work together in unity and oneness of purpose so that we can function effectively in serving Christ and proclaiming the gospel. Sometimes members of the church have a hard time becoming part of the body. By nature we can often resist being dependent on others or having others depend on us. When we do that we cease to function properly as a church and it lessens our impact in serving God. God has equipped each individual member with gifts and talents for the building up of the body. The church and its members are one in Christ. May we always be mindful that as believers we are members of the church and that each of us are called to serve Christ, each other, and the world around us. God bless, Pastor John.
