

ENCOURAGING WORDS, FIGHTING PRAYERS

Last Sunday morning, a member of our church family asked if they could chat to me in private. In my experience, such a request usually leads to a conversation about what needs improving with our church, the buildings, the worship or my ministry. However, I was pleasantly surprised to hear them say, "I just wanted to say thank you for all you do as our pastor." Now I am not saying that is the first time anyone has said that to me. I have been overwhelmingly blessed by the support and encouragement that my church family has given me in my 11 years here at Coolum. But for some reason, this particular moment really resonated with me and buoyed my heart at a time when I believe pastoral ministry in general is under so much pressure. The challenges of gaining momentum after the COVID pandemic and increasing cultural intolerance have made the issues of church leadership more acute in recent years. Tragically, the most intense pressure on pastors is often caused by "friendly fire" from people within their churches. So many of my pastoral colleagues are on the verge of breakdown because of constant criticism from people within their congregation. So, this morning I want to invite you to continue to encourage your church leaders (myself, Harrison, our elders and our deacons) and to continue to fight for us with your prayers. As leaders of the church we are under intense spiritual attack. Satan wants to derail our faith, to discourage us, to wreck our marriages and to destroy our ministry. So please pray for our spiritual growth, for our marriages and families and for us to be striving to honour Christ in all we do. Pray for protection, for joy and refreshment, for humility and for boldness and effectiveness in proclaiming the gospel. I am not saying that we don't makes mistakes as pastors and leaders. Unfortunately, I will preach a dud sermon, make a bad decision, let you down and hurt you at times. Sometimes this will be due to my sin and failure and if it is serious then it should certainly be addressed prayerfully and lovingly. But Peter also reminds us that every relationship in the church family needs to be sustained by a willingness to overlook failings and faults (1 Peter 4:8).

The Christian life is difficult, and I am not suggesting that pastors or church leaders have a monopoly on suffering. But in my experience, and from the Scriptures, it often seems that pastors and church leaders are under the most pressure. As Paul notes, "then in addition to all these things, I have the daily burden of my concern for all the churches" (2 Corinthians 11:28). Their role in teaching the gospel, leading and guarding their church family will generally result in more intense spiritual attack than others. So, may I encourage you to give thanks for your pastors and leaders. Look to encourage us with some kind words and keep fighting for us in your prayers. God bless, Pastor John.
