

"Are You Trapped Or Secure"

"And now, Israel, what does the Lord your God require of you? He requires only that you fear the Lord your God, and live in a way that pleases him, and love him and serve him with all your heart and soul." (Deuteronomy 10:12)

"Fear of the Lord is the foundation of true knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline." (Proverbs 1:9)

Having a fear of the Lord makes a huge difference in our life. It is the motivation for us to live a God-pleasing life and it is the beginning of wisdom - just like the alphabet is the beginning of reading. In this particular context, the meaning of fear is to be overwhelmed and controlled by something - to be in awe and reverence. Either God and our relationship with him will be the centre of our life and define our reality or it will be mankind and our relationship with this world that will define our reality. The fear of God leads to wisdom, joy and hope while the fear of man leads to misery, compromise, and disappointment. So, what does a healthy fear of God look like? When Martin Luther struggled with this question, he made the distinction between what he called a servile fear and a filial fear. The servile fear is a kind of fear that a prisoner in a torture chamber has for his tormentor, the jailer, or the executioner. It is an anxiety that comes from the clear and present danger that is represented by another person. Or it's the kind of fear that a slave would have at the hands of a malicious master who would come with the whip and torment the slave. Filial fear on the other hand refers to the fear that a child has for their father. It's where there is tremendous respect and love for their father and a deep desire to please them. There is no fear of pain or punishment, only the fear of displeasing the one who is the sources of your security and love. A servile fear only strives to refrain from sinning because it hates the consequences (it's all about me). A filial fear strives to refrain from sinning because it doesn't want to grieve or offend God (it's all about Him). The right fear of God is having an overwhelming sense of awe and respect for the majesty and love of God. Sadly, such a fear can often be lacking in contemporary evangelical Christianity, where we can be guilty of becoming to cavalier and flippant with God. Yes, we are invited to call him Abba, Father, and to have the personal relationship with Him, but that doesn't mean we don't maintain a humble and healthy respect and adoration for our holy God. The more we stand in awe of His holiness, the more we will joyfully live in the awe of His grace and love.
