

"The God of All Comfort" (2 Corinthians 1:1-11)

Thought for the Welk

We have recently witnessed the tragic floods in Libya, Greece and Turkey and the earthquake in Marrakech. Tens of thousands of people have died and some of these people would have been God fearing Christians. We are also seeing wars, terrorism and diseases devastating so many communities across the world. In our own country we see crime in plague proportions and legislation which has current and future consequences for Christian beliefs. On top of this we all have our own family and health struggles that can so easily get us down. Then we read Jesus say in Matthew 11:28–30,

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

It is easy for us to ask, how can this be? How is being yoked to Jesus easy? My mother once told me that my great grandfather was a bullock team driver. In a bullock team, they would place a young bull next to a strong old, experienced bul. They yoked them together so that the older bull would lead the new bull to follow the driver's instructions and carry on when the going gets tough. It is tough for the young bull as he is dragged and forced to learn the hard but correct way, until he too eventually pulls just as hard as the lead bull. This is the way it is with Jesus. Jesus does the heavy lifting for us. He wants to guide us and show us the right way in each situation. What He asks of us is to follow Him, to trust Him no matter how hard our situations seem, no matter how depressing the prevailing problems or attitudes seem. Jesus never promised us that the journey would be easy. He promised us that the load would be easy if we take our burdens to Him. 1 Peter 5:6-8 says, "Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you." God asks us to call out to him and trust the situation to Him. The Bible says that God works all things out for good to those who are His. But as I said to a friend of mine who has undergone tragedy in his life, the good may not be directed at us. Sometimes the blessing are to others, who witness us go through tragedy. They watch to see if we continue to positively trust Him and give Him the glory. It is that witness that brings many to faith in God. Let me encourage you to take your burdens to God, to trust Him for the outcomes and find rest in the care that He has for you.
