"New Heavens.. New Earth" (Revelation 21:1-5)

Thought for the Welk

In 1 Samuel 3 we read how God told a young boy named Samuel to bring some terrible news to Eli, who was the High Priest of Israel and his mentor. Samuel had to tell Eli that God was about to destroy his family because he had been a poor father and let his sons blaspheme God and do many wicked things. As Eli received this terrible news of divine judgment he uttered these faith filled words, "It is the Lord. Let him do what seems good to him." (3:18). Having received the most agonizing news, he didn't lash out at Samuel but rather responded in faith and in confidence and submission to God. In essence, he responded in a way that ought to inspire us whenever are faced with tough news.

Here are few reflections upon the lessons we can learn.

Eli is mainly concerned for God's glory. He knew his sons were wicked sinners who mocked the name of the Lord. Eli's affirmation of God's judgment displays his concern for the glory of the name of the Lord over the preservation of his own name.

Eli recognizes God's sovereign goodness. Eli trusted that whatever God did was good, though he may not be able to see the goodness in it. If something does not seem good to us, we often demand an explanation and as such reveal that we do not have confidence in the sovereign goodness of God. If God is good, his will must also be good, even when we struggle to see it.

Eli submitted to the wisdom and authority of the Lord. God has omniscient-Creator knowledge, while we have sinful-creature knowledge. All too often, we prefer to trust in our own wisdom and knowledge. In blind foolishness, we do not fear the Lord and don't trust in his wisdom.

Eli did not raise his fist to the heavens, but rather bowed his knee to God. He was willing to give God praise even when his heart was broken. It's easy to praise His name in the good times, but by God's grace we should also praise his name in the dark times too.

Despite Eli's many shortcomings as a parent, he was a great example to Samuel and to us. There is much we can learn from his words, actions and attitude at the revelation of God's divine will. Though his heart must have been shattered and grieved, Eli loved God and trusted him. Though our hearts may be shattered and grieved, we too must love and trust Him. Whether God brings good times or tough news into our life, may we always be striving to say, "It is the Lord. Let him do what seems good to him."
