

Thought for the Welk

FOUR LESSONS FROM THE FALL

In the last verse of Genesis chapter 2 we see how Adam and Eve are unashamedly enjoying the 'very good' world that God had created. However, that all dramatically changes in chapter 3, when Adam and Eve are deceived by Satan into distorting, denying and defying God's Word. This rebellion against God's Word caused Adam and Eve, and all of creation, a lot of pain, misery, suffering and death. Sadly, it has been the same throughout all of history and that's why we need to hold onto the 4 personal applications that this tragic passage still teaches us today.

1. God's Word must be the only standard by which we are to live our lives and to resist temptation. Jesus fended off temptation by affirming God's Word. His response to Satan's temptations was the same each time - "The Scriptures say..." (Matthew 4:4, 7, 10). While Adam and Eve guestioned and added to God's Word, Jesus elevated its authority by standing firm on what God says. 2. Sin is our problem, not a mean-spirited God or our childhood or social environment. Adam and Eve experienced no childhood trauma; their "Father" (God) was gracious and provided all that they needed to live fulfilling and joyous lives. Yet they willingly still rebelled against God and chose to sin. 3. The suffering in this world is a result of our sin. While it may not be easy to understand, the Bible tells us that everyone is guilty of sin (Romans 3:23) and deserves the punishment of death (Romans 6:23). In the eyes of our perfectly holy God, there are no true cases of innocent suffering, except for that of His one and only Son, Jesus Christ. The death of Christ is the only case of a genuinely innocent person suffering, and He did so to reconcile us to God (2 Corinthians 5:21). 4. Our only solution to suffering and death (separation from God) is Jesus Christ. God, in His infinite mercy and amazing grace, provides a way for us to escape the tragic consequence of sin. Even as God was banishing and cursing Adam and Eve for their sin, He was also promising to provide a way for them to once again regain His presence and blessings for eternity. In Genesis 3:15, God promised that there would be a man (an offspring of Eve) who would crush Satan and reverse the curse of death. That offspring was Jesus and, at just the right time, He came on a rescue mission for creation (Romans 5:1-6). His mission was die and pay for our sins so that He could end evil and suffering without ending us.

May we rejoice that, even in this darkest of hours at the dawn of history, God had a plan to purchase our redemption and bring us the hope of eternal life with Him. To God be the glory!
