HANDICAPS AS ASSETS

Dan Chun is the pastor of a Presbyterian church in Honolulu.

He tells the story of a teenager who had lost his left arm in a horrendous car accident. The boy was extremely depressed. One day, the boy told his father that he would like to take judo lessons because it was possible to do judo with just one arm. The father, eager to do anything that might cheer up his son, quickly he agreed and secured a sensei to instruct his son.

The young man went for lessons three times a week, and while he learned some basic judo movements, most of the time was concentrated on learning just one move. Time and time again, the training sessions focused on this one specific move that the judo teacher insisted that the boy learn perfectly. After a couple months, the judo teacher announced to this young man that he was going to be entered into a tournament. The teenager responded with surprise. "Sensei," he exclaimed, "I've only been taking judo for a couple months. I only know one move very well, and I only have one arm. I don't think I'm ready for a tournament." But the Sensei insisted.

The day of the tournament came and to the young man's surprise, he made his way through the first round and then the second and the third round. He couldn't believe his success. What ultimately surprised him was that he made his way to the finals. Confronting the champion of the state, he was sure he was going to be destroyed, but to his amazement, he not only survived but also was victorious. On the drive home, the young man turned to his Sense and said, "I don't understand this, Sensei. I have been taking judo lessons for only a couple months. I only really know one move and I only have one arm. My left arm is gone and yet I just beat the state champion. I just won't the tournament. Sensei how is this possible?"

The Sensei responded with great dignity, "you have won for two reasons. First, the one move that you do know well is the most effective move in all of judo. The second reason why you won is because the only defence against that move is to grab your opponents left arm!" Jesus makes it clear that in our weaknesses, He finds strength. In short, what we consider to be liabilities and shortcomings, can be turned into assets when we are yielded to the service of Christ. James would agree with that totally!
