Thought for the Week

In WW2 there were hundreds of Australians who volunteered as 'Coastwatchers' in PNG, Rabaul, Solomon Islands and Guadalcanal. These were Australian spies who hid in the jungles and mountain tops and gave radio broadcasts of Japanese movements. These broadcasts saved thousands of Allied lives. But Coastwatchers also picked up and rescued downed Allied pilots and sailors and got them transport back to safety.

On 1 August 1943, a number of American PT boats were sent off to attack four Japanese destroyers. One of these PT boats was sliced in two by a destroyer, killing two but eleven managed to survive by clinging to flotsam. The skipper was a lieutenant who bravely gathered the survivors together and headed them off to a very small but deserted island. With no food or water on the island, the lieutenant swam out daily into the sea to try and attract any passing American ships, but to no avail.

High up on the mountain top of Kolombangara Island, the Australian Coastwatcher, Reg Evans could see the perilous position the sailors were in. He sent help in the form of some nationals way down to the beach area where they paddled canoes across to the small island to rescue the sailors. They were brought back eventually up to the mountain top for treatment before having them rescued. The brave lieutenant's name was Lt Kennedy, John Fitzgerald Kennedy.

From Heaven, God saw the perilous position mankind was in, so He sent His son, Jesus to come down to earth to rescue us. The difference between the stories is that for us to be saved, our rescuer had to sacrifice His own life. JFK only became president; our Saviour is the King of Kings.

Pray that our people would grow closer to God and be true ambassadors for Him this year. Pray that God would mightily bless our church in this coming year.


